The facilities at Miakonda are legendary, including an eight tree house campsite, a teepee village staffed with real American Indians, and the world's longest swimming pool, which was nearly a tenth of a mile long, holding nearly 1.3 million gallons of water. The scouting museum at the camp is second to none! Hope to see you there!
